



Since I came home, my family has been able to host several of the young people I befriended in Hiroshima.






At this point, I believe my ministry will likely focus on student and English ministry and I'll probably be returning to Hiroshima to join the team I've labored alongside before; but I'm holding these plans loosely and depending on the Spirit's leading.

# A Spiritual Snapshot of Japan


My college friend and I near the famous "floating" *torii* (Shinto gate) on Miyajima in Hiroshima Prefecture, July 2016

Shinto: "The Way of God(s)"

*Shinto* is a native Japanese religion without a founder or fixed dogmas and with no official sacred scriptures, yet it is closely connected to Japanese values and patterns of thought and behavior; *Shinto* influence can be observed in social interactions and personal motivations. (https://www.britannica.com/topic/Shinto)

### **Buddhism**

Buddhists don't follow a god but rather a path of morality, meditation, and wisdom that they believe leads to enlightenment, or a state of inner peace and wisdom. Buddhists follow The Four Noble Truths and believe in karma (a law of cause and effect) and reincarnation (the continuous cycle of rebirth). (https://www.history.com/topics/religion/buddhism)

In Japan, religion is generally viewed as a private affair and isn't discussed much; rituals for birth, marriage, death, and festivals throughout the year ("matsuri") are generally the most visible manifestations of Japanese religious practice.

### Some prayer points for Japan:

### Suicide

"Japan has one of the world's highest suicide rates, and suicide is the leading cause of death for people under 30. ... There was a suicide in Japan every 15 minutes, with close to 33,000 reported in 2009."

### Shut-ins: Hikikomori

"There are an estimated 1 million people in Japan who don't leave their rooms; they are called *hikikomori*. They are enabled by parents who financially support them and who do not seek help because their child's condition is seen as shameful. Japanese society can be very heavy at times with a 'one size fits all' mentality and a lack of grace and second (or third) chances. Many *hikikomori* were either bullied, did not fit in, or had a failure that they felt they couldn't recover from." ### Obstacles to the Gospel

"There are no restrictions on evangelism or preaching about the gospel in Japan. Nevertheless, Japan remains largely unresponsive to Christian teaching. About 70% of all churches have an average attendance of less than 30, though membership is double this figure. Many people work on Sundays and do not attend church every week." Another difficulty facing Christianity in Japan is that some Japanese attempt to simply combine "Christian concepts with Japanese traditional beliefs." ### Missionary Burnout (including among Japanese Christians)

"Christian missionaries find Japan a tough nut to crack. They always have, ever since the first of them, St. Francis Xavier, landed in Kyushu in 1549. His first impression, based on an initially friendly reception, was, 'In my opinion no people superior to the Japanese will be found among the unbelievers.' Two years later, he left disheartened, calling Japanese Buddhism 'an invention of the devil.'"
